### The foundation



The establishment of the International Society of Soil Science (ISSS) occurred during the Fourth International Conference of Pedology in Rome on May 19, 1924, in the International Agriculture Institute housed in Villa Lubin.

### The founders



- Patronage of the Ministry of Economy, the President of the Council of Ministers, and the King of Italy, who attended the opening ceremony.
- 463 adherents: 21 official delegations, 3 governments without official representation, 303 members from 39 countries, 120 scientific Institutions, and 16 economic and industrial institutions.

### The developments: from the ISSS to the IUSS



- In 1924, a Secretary General was elected and a President from the hosting country of the next WCSS
- In 1998, new Statutes and name were declared at the 16th Congress in Montpellier decoupling the position of the president from the organization of the World Congress of Soil Science.
- The IUSS has an elected president who serves for 6 years (2 years as President-Elect, 2 years as President and 2 years as Past President) and a Vice President WCSS.
- The IUSS continued to have a Secretary General and a Deputy Secretary General until 2014.
- From 2015 to 2022, the IUSS had a permanent secretariat based in Vienna, and since 2023 in Rome.
- The scientific duties have been taken over by the presidential committee, whereas the administrative duties are handled by the secretariat.
- Six commissions were established in 1924: (I) soil physics, (II) soil chemistry, (III) soil biology, (IV) nomenclature and classification of soils, (V) soil cartography and (VI) plant physiology in relation to pedology.

### The structure



- The IUSS is a free and autonomous organization, financed primarily by member contributions, providing a reputation for soil scientists and a collaborative space.
- The IUSS is based on two pillars:
- it is a union of national societies or academies (the Full members),
- it is an organization of soil scientists (the Individual members).

### The IUSS Full an Individual Members

- The Full members of the IUSS are 76 National Soil Science Societies or Academia.
- The estimated Individual members (through the National Soil Science Societies) is about 50,000
- The IUSS holds relationships with 8 regional societies:

African Soil Science Society (ASSS),

East and Southeast Asia Federation of Soil Science Societies (ESAFS),

European Confederation of Soil Science Societies (ECSSS),

Federation of Eurasian Soil Science Societies (FESSS),

Latin American Soil Science Society (SLCS),

Soil Science Society of East Africa (SSSEA),

Pacific Regional Society of Soil Science (PRSSS),

Central Asian Soil Science Society (CASSS)

  - Over 2000 events organized for the World Soil Day on the 5<sup>th</sup> of December, in collaboration with the FAO
  - 2 Bulletins and 12 Alerts
  - 1-2 Books, also open source
- Awards and prizes:
  - the Dokuchaev Award and Von Liebig Award, for basic and applied researches;
  - the Jeju Award for young and mid-career soil scientist;
  - the IUSS Distinguished Service Medal, for outstanding world soil leaders who have translated soil science into action;
- Honorary members
- Promotion of individual member by other scientific organization, such as the ISC
- IUSS Stimulus Fund and projects


